HACKNEY Substitution LEIGH

Instructions

- Use the recyclable materials to create the structures for your home theatre. A box works as a good base, then add a roof made from other another box or cardboard.
- You will need to cut a rectangle out of the front of your box to use as your 'stage'.
- Use grease-proof baking paper (improvise, if you don't have any) to create the screen. Tape it on the inside of the box structure.
- Decorate the outside to look like a house.
- Cut out the characters and stick them on the wooden skewers.
- Use a torch or light to shine from behind your box and create your

show with the shadow puppets.

Shadow puppetry, is an ancient form of storytelling and entertainment, likely to have originated in Central Asia-China or in India in the 1st millennium BCE. It spread throughout Europe at the end of the 17th century. The puppeteer uses cut-out figures to create a show of shadows, having the character's displayed behind a screen, and using light to share the show.
